September 1939

September 1939 – May 1940

Morton listed as photographer for 1940 YACKETY YACK

**Banned cover of CAROLINA BUCCANEER**

November 1939

Greyard. Byrne "G. B." Lamm '41 becomes "ace photographer" replacing Fred Sutton. (Morton not yet involved with publication.)

**Morton buys camera at Raleigh pawn shop**

February 1940

"Winter of 1940"; immediately begins work for CAROLINA BUCCANEER under Bill Stauber.

March 1940

Nothing in subsequent issues for 1939-1940 (volume 70); photographs only on covers, interior illustrations are graphics only.

**Photographer for CAROLINA BUCCANEER**

March 1940 – May 1940

First staff listing; March 1940 issue includes multi-image layout for montage "That' Week-End"

**Portrait of Lt. M. M. Riker, U. S. N. on cover of CAROLINA MAGAZINE**

October 1940

**Gene Witten named TAR AN' FEATHERS editor**

November 1940

selects Lamm as photography editor DTH 11/7/40, page 1

**Listed as photographer in TAR AN' FEATHERS masthead**

November 1940 – May 1941

Begins with winter issue (Volume 1 Number 2) so month is an approximation. G. B. Lamm is photography editor.

"My first published picture for a UNC student publication" in book HUGH MORTON' NORTH CAROLINA. [incorrect]

**Morton imminent enlistment in U. S. Army announced in DTH**

Sep 23, 1942

Morton's last batch of photographs, "taken of the football team several weeks ago . . ."

**Visits UNC for weekend to photograph UNC-Wake Forest football game**

Sep 26, 1942 – Sep 27, 1942

"Back for a weekend visit to Carolina before entering the Army Tuesday [29 September] as a technical sergeant in the photography division, Hugh Morton was drafted by the Daily Tar Heel to take pictures of yesterday's game [September 26]." -DTH, 27 September 1942, page 1

**Photographs at UNC while on furlough**

Mar 25, 1943 – Mar 29, 1943

"In town for the past few days was Hugh Morton of photographic fame." Ten-day furlough from Camp Davis; helped Ben Snyder on the Yackety Yack, then departed for Linville and will go from there back to camp. DTH 30 Mar, p.3. See link for known photograph made on this trip.
