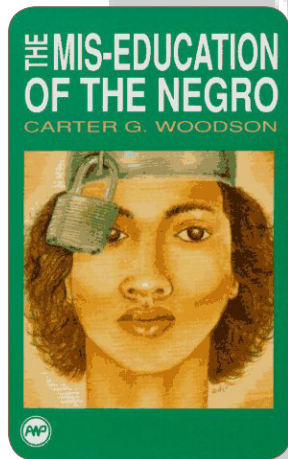


HR 57, Carter G. Woodson and Music Education
